




Aysha-Lynn Estrella was named the Williams-Hutchins award recipient for the cohort class of 2023. Aysha-Lynn's primary objective was to advocate for food sovereignty and outline potential policy changes that can help address high obesity and food insecurity rates in the state of Hawai'i. Historical factors, socioeconomic disparities, and the shift towards Western diets have disrupted traditional food systems, which, in turn, have led to adverse health outcomes for Native Hawaiians. The policy suggestions made were informed through research using data analysis and literature reviews. The main conclusion of the project was that greater land allocation for the purpose of growing traditional foods could help address obesity and food insecurity rates. Congratulations, Aysha-Lynn!


